The Principal welcomed all the PTA members present and asked the Secretary to read aloud the minutes of previous PTA meeting.

After the reading all attendees approved the minutes of the previous meeting.

Resolving the query of Class 2 PTA member, Mrs. Megha Bagadia, for providing lunch after exams, Principal clarified that students willing to stay back may have lunch at 12:30 PM before leaving. If a student opts for school meals on any exam day, they must continue for all days to avoid food wastage.

To UKG PTA member Mrs. Sneha Bharuka's concern about giving practice for school dining etiquettes to UKG students for at least once in a week to cope up in Class 1, Principal clarified by saying that the students will learn all the dining etiquettes in the first month of. April after getting promoted to class 1.

Class 5 PTA member, Mrs. Pallavi Nathani raised a query to take initiatives to improve the performance of the underperforming students in one of the primary classes. Principal said that efforts have already been taken by the teachers in classroom teaching as well as during remedial teaching. Principal requested the parents to meet in person with the teachers to discuss the performance of their wards. Principal also stressed the need to build students' consistency to school, parents to insure the same.

Primary Co-ordinator raised concern about the absenteeism among students and to take efforts personally to improve their reading and writing skills.

UKG PTA member, Ms. Sneha Bharuka expressed appreciation for teachers' efforts in remedials and personal attention to students. Instances were shared by Class 6 PTA member, Ms. Sandhya Sethiya where students quickly picked up on missed learning after being absent. Teachers' consistent efforts were acknowledged and valued. Competitions were well organized and highly appreciated by both parents and students.

Answering to the query of Class 9 PTA member, Mrs Maniyar, regarding change in the exam schedule, Principal clarified that the step was taken to standardized the process.

Class 1 PTA member, Mr Gaurav Modi suggested **FAQs** should be prepared by school for commonly asked questions for parents' queries to clear the common doubts, which was agreed by principal. Principal also requested parents to send the common questions to the school so that it could be compiled and circulated in the groups for all the parents.

On the concern raised on model question papers by class 5 PTA member, Pallavi Nathani, Principal emphasised on the fact that "We teach beyond exam patterns to build creativity.

Primary coordinator Mrs, Archana Jakkalwar appreciated the new initiative taken for birthday celebration, where students brought saplings and donated books to the school library.

School counsellor Ms Jyoti Dhakne elaborated about Digital Detox challenge held by students during exam time. Secondary Coordinator Mrs. Rajkumari Bansode appreciated the efforts of students (classes 6–7) to reduce mobile addiction.

Class 9 PTA member, Mrs. Maniyar raised concern that students participating in the MUNs should be well prepared by teachers. Mrs. Maniyar also informed that private whatsapp groups were created by other schools where students interacted with each other and discussed on the various roles of the delegates and committees. To this the Senior Secondary Coordinator Mr Vaibhav Nikalje replied that Orientation sessions for MUNs already take place in school and the teachers guide the MUN participants.
